Dear Dr. Cherry:

Thank you for your submission of October 19, 2020, regarding the proposed move of the Nancy Jones House, Wake County, North Carolina, a property listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The house is being moved to forestall demolition. You have included documentation justifying the move, describing the new site, and evaluating the archeological potential of the new site.

On November 27, 2020, we approved the proposed move. The Nancy Jones House will remain listed in the National Register during the move. Final approval of continued listing of the house on its new site will be issued after the move. After the monument has been relocated, please provide a letter notifying us of the date of the move, along with photographs of the monument in its new location, and, on continuation sheets, a new verbal boundary description, acreage figure, UTM or lat/long point, and a location map. Once we have received this documentation, we will issue a final approval of the Nancy Jones House's continued listing in the National Register. The Nancy Jones House was originally listed under Criteria A, B, and C. Removal of the building from its original site severs the necessary associations that are required to satisfy Criteria A and B. Documentation submitted should acknowledge this situation and emphasize the Criterion C significance.

We appreciate the interest of the building's owners in preserving this historic resource and look forward to hearing of the successful move.
